EMPOWERING CHILDREN WITH BODY SAFETY AWARENESS

The art of puppetry is a platform for communicating important lessons to primary school students between the ages of 7 and 12 about body safety awareness. The puppet performance equipped school students with the knowledge and abilities they need to recognise abuse when it occurs, express the problem in appropriate language, and locate responsible adults who may offer assistance. On 18.11.2022, M.Ed.II year students went on to Kalaimagal Matric Higher Secondary School, Omalur, Salem to create awareness about Safe and Unsafe touch recognition skills through puppetry among VI standard students. The prospective teacher educators also gave some real-life examples for effective comprehension of the topic. In addition to discussing safe and unsafe touch, the activity insisted students that it is never their fault if someone else crosses safe bounds. Our prospective teacher-educator also helped children make a list of adults they can talk to at home and at school if they ever feel unsafe or uneasy. Students learn that no one should touch their body in a way that makes them feel uncomfortable or unsafe by categorizing touches as safe, unsafe, or ambiguous. Students practice setting limits and learn the Safety Saying: "Say no, get away, tell someone." As an outcome of the activity, our prospective teacher educators found that the students had a strong understanding of the precise techniques to avoid or handle difficult situations, as well as a favourable and emphatic inclination towards the script written by used in the puppetry about what defines sexual inappropriateness.

 between the ages of 15 and 34.
- The goal of the Indian Road Safety Campaign, solve in India, is to make Indian roads safer through multisectoral, youth-led community initiatives.
- Driver distraction from using a phone or other electronic device while driving
 has increased the risks to road safety. With focused effort, it is possible to
 address issues with driver behaviour, road design and engineering defects,
 and lack of understanding and awareness of traffic rules and regulations.


- The methods for preventing costly traffic fines, significant offenses, the loss of driving privileges, etc. are road safety measures.

Sri Sarada College of Education organised an awareness programme to student-teachers on child protection rights with the goal to raise awareness of sexual exploitation in schools among teachers, managers, and other staff members so that school children would be better safeguarded. The programme commenced with the welcome address and introduction about the resource person Mr.Simon Raj, Department of Child Protection Rights, Collectorate, Salem-8

The Resource person emphasized the following points to make student-teachers aware of the child protection.

Highlights:

- The Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act was passed by the Indian government in 2012 to make India's position on child protection even clearer than previously.
- It is a specific law that imposes severe penalties on anyone who sexually abuses or assaults a child and treats everyone under the age of 18 as a child.
- According to the POCSO Act, aggravated sexual assault and aggravated penetrative sexual assault are both criminal offences, as is any type of sexual abuse or assault involving children, including the use or storage of pornographic material involving children.

- Three years in prison is the maximum possible sentence. The law's significant clause holds that failing to notify a case is punishable. This is punishable by a six-month prison sentence, a fine, or both.
- The POCSO Act's gender neutrality, which acknowledges that boys can also be sexual
 assault victims, is another distinguishing aspect. From reporting and documenting
 evidence to investigating and trying offenders, POCSO Act has made an effort to
 make it child-friendly in every way.
- The Government of India has made a tonne of materials available to the general public in order to ensure that the POCSO Act is implemented effectively.

Evidence of success: This opened the door for a discussion on preventative measures, advice, and possible warning signs of child abuse that student-teachers should be aware of.
