LOCAL COMMUNITY BASED ACTIVITIES

Igniting the Knowledge (Illam Theedi Kalvi)

Our B.Ed. students participated in the State Government scheme "Illam Thedi Kalvi" (Education at doorsteps), a flagship programme, which seeks to address the learning gap that developed among students as a result of the shutdown of schools during the Covid-19 outbreak. Our students took special classes for Government school students from Standard I to X in order to provide them the knowledge and skills they needed. Our students tutored the school children on certain topics which have social importance such as health and hygiene and girls' safety including prevention of sexual harassment along with the school subjects. Students obtained a stipend Rs.1000/- month for the service.

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B.Ed. Students acted as Field investigators for National Assessment Survey 2022

Four B.Ed I year students S. Hanushavarthini, N.T. Roshni, N.Niroshini and R.Nishanthi were selected as the field investigators and were given training by the DIET lecturers at Sri Sarada College of Education (Autonomous), Salem, for the National Assessment Survey 2022 to evaluate the learning competency of the primary school children post-pandemic. The lecturers meticulously trained the Field investigators on how to handle the children and assess them. They also gave a detailed explanation of how to select the students through the UDISE code. After 3 days of training (9.03.2022, 10.03.2022, 11.03.2022) in the college, the students were sent to Government Higher Secondary School, Periyapudur, Salem to conduct Mock Assessment with the assistance of the DIET lecturers Dr. B.Ananthi and Dr.PSO. Kesavan, Uthamacholapuram, Salem. On 22.03.2022, N.T.Roshini assessed the students of Government High School, Vaiyapuri Street, Ammapet, Salem while S.Hanushavarthini went to Sri Sarada Nursery and Primary School, Salem, N.Nishanthi, Bharathi Vidyalaya, Salem and R.Niroshini, Government High School, Pagalpatty, Salem as Field Investigators. On 26.03.2022, the Field Investigators joined SCERT in evaluating students learning competencies as a measure of the effectiveness of the education system, which enabled the higher officials to take suitable remedial actions for the school children. Our students evaluated the “reading skill, mental ability and understanding capacity” of the school students. They evaluated through the “rubrics” given by the DIET committee. After the completion of the field investigation, the DIET Principal congratulated the students, and they were given certificates and remuneration.

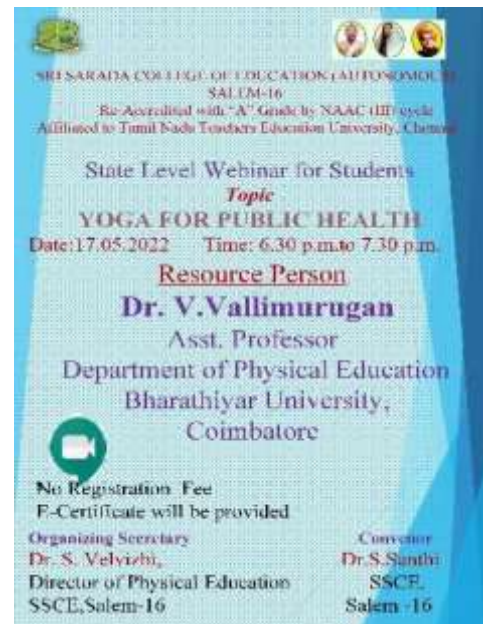
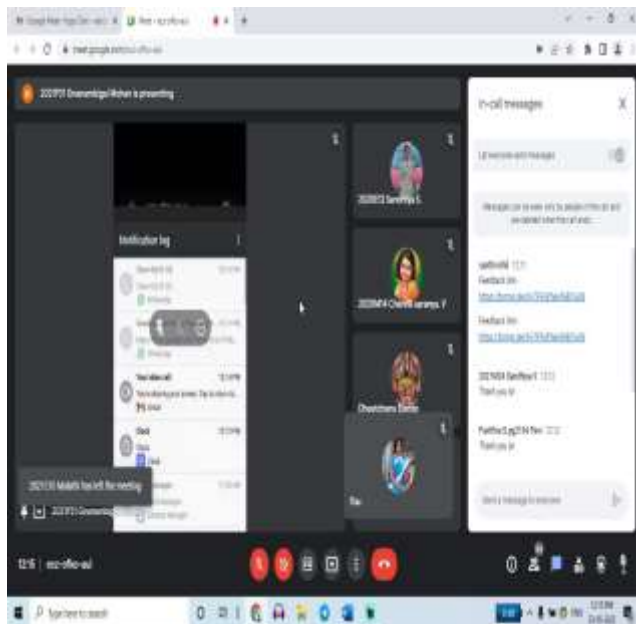
State level webinar on ‘Yoga for Public Health’

The B.Ed. students along with the faculty members visited St. Joseph Orphanage home, Andipatti Village, Salem to spend their precious time with orphan students which give them joy and pleasure. The facility of the home was very orderly and regimented, with weekly meal plans and a daily routine for the children. Their eating manners were highly formal. The visit was intended to make student-teachers fully understand the fact that orphan children have potential to excel in curricular and co-curricular activities. Our B.Ed students performed some amusement activities such as songs, dance, story-telling, antakshari, and games with the orphan children to make the children happy. On realizing the educational needs of the orphan children, our student-teachers donated some reading and writing materials such as pencils, scales, pens, notebooks and story books. This activity helped student-teachers to be sensitized with a sense of compassion and to understand the needs of underprivileged children in our society. Students who participated in this activity learnt that they have obligations to society and its well-being beyond their own academic pursuits and professional development.



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Oral Cancer Awareness Programme

Cancer is a significant public health concern on a global scale. In collaboration with the Rotary club and dentists from Vinayaka Mission Medical College, Cancer Awareness programme was conducted at Erumapalayam, Salem on 03.03.2019. The programme's major objective was to spread knowledge and awareness about oral cancer prevention among the general public. Our student participated in the rally throughout the Erumapalayam area by joining the Rotary club and the dentists from Vinayaka Mission Medical College, Salem, and gave out pamphlets to every house that explained the precautions that should be taken by people to prevent oral cancer. The pamphlets provided information on early warning symptoms, diagnostic and preventive measures of oral cancer. Along with the Rotary Club and Vinayaka Mission Medical College dentists, our staff and students participated in the oral cancer (dental) check-up camp to the general public in that area. Student-teachers gained knowledge of service learning as a result of the activity, enabling them to take part in charitable endeavours in the near future.

On 24.10.2019 students along with staff members went to Isha Nursery at Sanyasigundu, Salem to extend a helping hand for the preparation of sapling bags. They helped the nursery by preparing 1500 sand pockets for the saplings. In appreciation of the effort of college students, the nursery donated a sapling to each student.



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Empowering Children with Body Safety Awareness

The art of puppetry is a platform for communicating important lessons to primary school students between the ages of 7 and 12 about body safety awareness. The puppet performance equipped school students with the knowledge and abilities they need to recognise abuse when it occurs, express the problem in appropriate language, and locate responsible adults who may offer assistance. On 18.11.2022, M.Ed. II year students visited Kalaimagal Matric Higher Secondary School, Omalur, Salem to create awareness about Safe and Unsafe touch recognition skills through puppetry among VI standard students. The prospective teacher educators also gave some real-life examples for effective comprehension of the topic. In addition to discussing safe and unsafe touch, the activity insisted students that it is never their fault if someone else crosses safe bounds. The M.Ed. students also helped children make a list of adults they can talk to at home and at school if they ever feel unsafe or uneasy. Students learn that no one should touch their body in a way that makes them feel uncomfortable or unsafe by categorizing touches as safe, unsafe, or ambiguous. Students practice setting limits and learn the Safety Saying: "Say no, get away, tell someone." As an outcome of the activity, it was found that the students had a strong understanding of the precise techniques to avoid or handle difficult situations, as well as a favourable and emphatic inclination towards the script written by used in the puppetry about what defines sexual inappropriateness.

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2. Practice teaching /internship in schools

Intensive Teaching practise is an essential part of teacher education since it allows student- teachers to put theory into practise. The second-year B.Ed. students are obliged to participate in a 16-week intensive teaching practise during the III semester as per NCTE and TNTEU regulations. After receiving the due permission from the CEO, our student-teachers are allotted to various Government- and Government-aided schools in and around the Salem District based on the requirement of the availability of classes. During the teaching practice, the students are meticulously monitored and moulded by the respective mentors at schools and through the visit of teacher educators.

Previously Mrs.K.Vimala, Principal, Sri Sarada Matriculation Higher Secondary School for Girls was the member of Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the college and Mrs.K.Malarvizhi, Post Graduate Teacher in English, Govt. Model school, Tharamangalam, Salem-6 is the member from 2021 onwards. During the meetings of those statutory bodies, a healthy discussion would happen about the ways and means of strengthening school-based practices. They highlighted the expectations of the schools from the internees in terms of academic and administrative support. The teacher educators expressed their concerns related to mentoring and supporting the student teachers during the practice teaching. The mutual discussion aimed at catering a better learning and teaching experience for the student teachers during the practice teaching period.

Gayatri Devi, Professor and Head of the department of Psychology, Avinashilingam University, Coimbatore by Dr.V.Arulselvi, Assistant Professor of Education. The Resource person gave a detailed account

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of Child Sexual Abuse and its education to the school teachers, to make them understand the condition of children who are the victims of sexual abuse.



Training program on Awareness and Preventive Education against Sexual Harassment (APoSH) for college students

On March 31, 2022, a training program on Awareness and Preventive Education against Sexual Harassment (APoSH) for college students was conducted at Sri Meenakshi College of Arts and Science in Erriyur, Pennagaram (Tk), Dharmapuri. The program aimed to empower college students to identify and prevent sexual harassment and to create a safe and inclusive campus environment where everyone feels respected and valued. The inauguration began at 10:30 AM with an inaugural address by Dr. K.P. ShanmugaVadivu, Assistant Professor of Education at Sri Sarada College of Education (Autonomous), Salem. Dr.K.P.ShanmugaVadivu emphasized the importance of awareness of sexual harassment for college students and how it affects people of all gender, ages, and backgrounds. The first session on Introduction to Awareness and Prevention of Sexual Harassment in Colleges started at 11:15 AM, with Dr.K.P.ShanmugaVadivu as the resource person. The session focused on recent policies on sexual harassment. The second session, on Indian Constitution and Prevention of Sexual Harassment, began at 12:00 PM, with Dr. R. SelvamathiSugirtha, Assistant Professor of Biological Science at Sri Sarada College of Education (Autonomous), Salem, as the resource person. Dr.Sugirtha highlighted the key provisions in the Indian Constitution to prevent sexual harassment. The third session on the POSH Act was conducted at 2:00 PM, with Dr. K.S. Ramakrishnan, Associate Professor at the School of Education at Tamil Nadu Open University, Chennai, as the resource person. This session focused on the POSH act and its steps towards creating safe and respectful workplaces for women in India. The act has raised awareness about

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the issue of sexual harassment and has provided a mechanism for women to seek justice and redressal in cases of sexual harassment at the workplace. The fourth session, on the POCSO Act, was conducted by Dr. V. Priya, Assistant Professor of Physical Science at Sri Sarada College of Education (Autonomous), Salem. This session provided a detailed explanation of the POCSO Act, which is a comprehensive law that provides for the protection of children from sexual offenses. The act recognizes the vulnerability of children and provides for a speedy and child-friendly justice system for the victims of sexual abuse. A focus group discussion was conducted for the participants at 4:00 PM, followed by the valediction at 4:30 PM. Finally, feedback was collected from all the participants through Google forms.

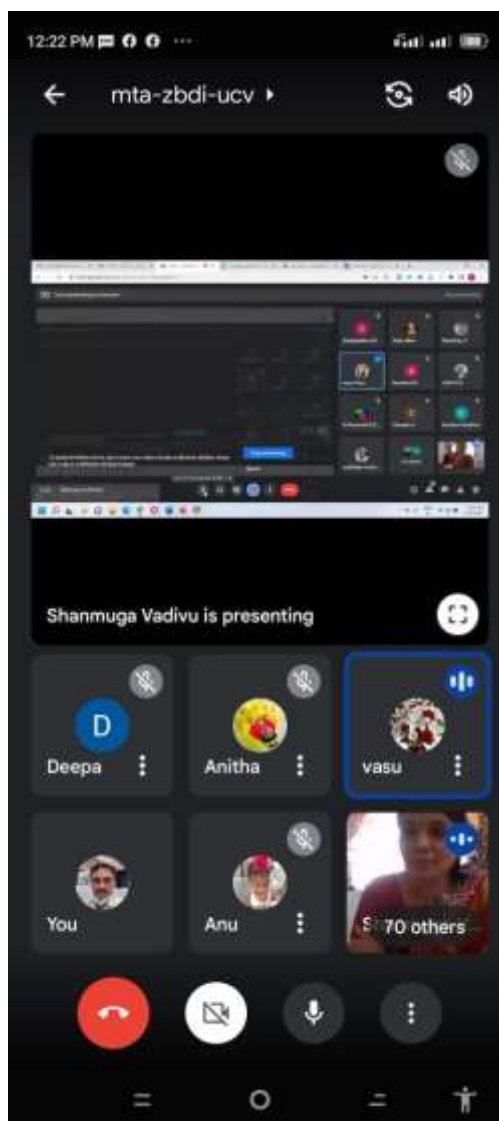
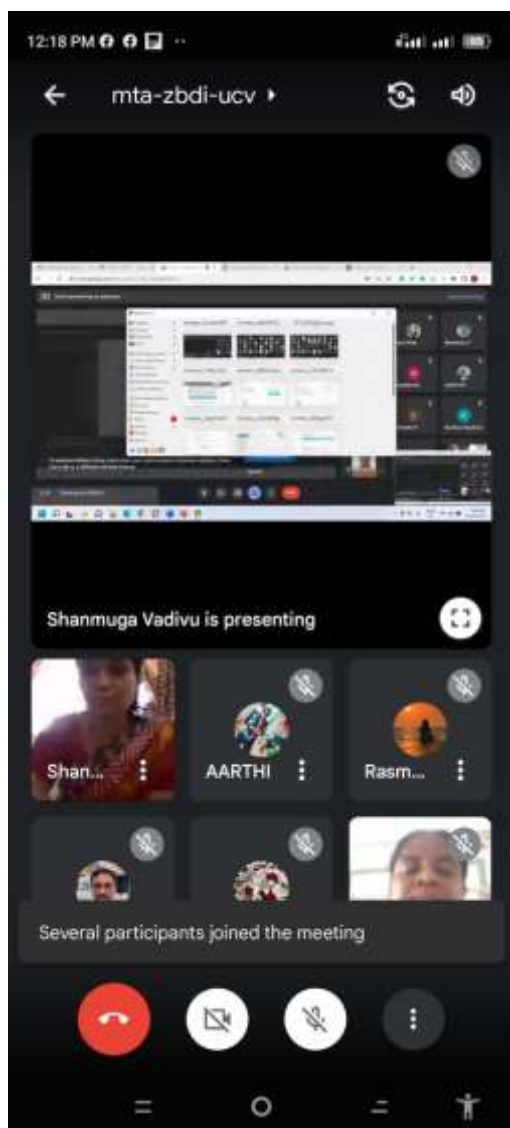
