In pursuance to the judgment of the Hon’ble Supreme court of India dated 8.5.2009 in civil appeal No. 887/2009, the UGC had notified “Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009”. At SSCOE, we have constituted an Anti-Ragging Committee in 2016 to ensure that its campus and accommodation facilities are free of the menace of ragging.

Ragging means drawing attention facetiously and persistently to the shortcomings. UGC has notified 3rd Amendment in UGC regulations on 29th June, 2016 to expand the definition of ragging by including the following:

“Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background”.

Anti-ragging Policy:

This policy emboldens entertaining of students to the academic environment of the Institution, simultaneously depressing and preventing any adverse acts on parts of senior students, which goes against the basic purpose of socio-academic integration.

The ‘anti-ragging policy’ adopted by the Institution is aimed at:

- (a) Establishment, evolution and nurturing a conducive, socio-academic environment within the student population.
- (b) Propagating and enduring a high level of confidence within new entrants and their parents/guardians to perceive that fresh entrants to the Institute are welcome and provided support, rather than being harassed and terrified.
- (c) Keeping in place an unified system to depress and prevent any adverse acts like ‘ragging’ by the seniors, which disturbs socio-academic integration of new entrants.
- (d) Determining hindrance measures for any encroachment of the “Anti-Ragging Policy” by way of disciplinary measures.
