## **Waste Management Policy**

### **Introduction**

### **Policy Statement**

Sri Sarada College for Education (Women), Salem, strive to reduce waste production and improve waste segregation by minimizing waste production and by maintaining healthy environmental practices for the staff as well as students. As part of the policy, the college is working to reduce its environmental impact and contribute positively to the local environment through sustainable waste management practices. Everyone at the institution is subject to this policy.

### **Policy Objectives**

- Segregate waste and dispose of it in a safe manner as part of promoting safe practices
- As much as possible, reduce waste generation and prefer repair, reuse, and recycling over disposal
- To provide guidance on how to handle and dispose of waste in a safe manner, consistent with health and safety regulations, to all staff and students
- Assisting all students and staff in handling waste and disposing of it in a healthy and safe manner in accordance with health and safety regulations
- Label and locate all waste containers properly.

### **Solid Waste Management**

- Solid wastes including food wastes are collected daily and dumped alternatively in the two pits made for the purpose in the eastern corner of the campus and allowed to decompose and used later as manure.
